

## Inspiring the next generations of blood donors



Over a remarkable career of blood donation that began when she was 17, Carol has donated more than 400 times and recently hit her 82-gallon milestone. Following the illness and passing of her late husband, Carol was driven by a desire to honor his memory and replace the units he needed. She began donating whole blood, then switched to platelets, donating every other week without fail.

Carol is more than a donor—she's a beacon of inspiration and a champion for the blood community. Her passion for promoting local donations and motivating others, especially young people, is unmatched. A longtime member of Purdue University's Agricultural and Biological Engineering department, she hosted numerous campus blood drives and actively encouraged students to give. Even after retiring, she continued to run five collection events annually to keep the momentum alive. Under her leadership, Purdue has held over 60 drives, collecting nearly 1,100 units each year.

Through her volunteering, Carol's kindness has reached far and wide. She once gathered Indianapolis Colts footballs from their Bleed Blue drives and sent them overseas to underprivileged children, spreading joy and the message of donation across the world.

He's served as a firefighter and EMT and held a variety of leadership roles for the local fire department's board. And his compassion extends far beyond his town's borders. In 2022, Jim and his wife opened their hearts and home to a family of Ukrainian refugees, guiding them through complex paperwork and helping them settle into their new life in America. Jim's only reward? To know that today, they are thriving members of his community.

## Showing the big heart of a small town community

In 2016, Tammy and Traci learned that Glenn Roberts, a local businessman, avid fisherman and hunter, and a beloved member of their small, South Georgia community, was battling an aggressive cancer. The duo, who both work at the local County Chamber of Commerce, rallied their 3,500 neighbors—“Our Tribe”, as they lovingly refer to their town “family”—and hosted a blood drive honoring Glenn. In under eight hours, with two bloodmobiles, they collected 103 blood products.

For Tammy, Traci, and the community, the event has become a symbol of hope, ability, and pride. The 10th Annual Glenn Roberts blood drive was held on April 25, 2025. With Tammy and Traci’s leadership, through spring rains and early summers, they have collected more than 200 gallons—for a total of 1,900 blood products.

Everyone eagerly participates—months in advance, volunteers arrive with supplies. Tammy and Traci assist with shirt designs, food donations, and the phone tree. “So many come out to give in a loved one’s name, and we are always left in awe. Feelings run deep here, and we are humbled when we witness an entire town coming together to circle the wagons.”

## Channeling the strength of a loved one to help others

Brenna lost her dad and brother when she was very young. Her cousin, Trevor, took her under his wing. “Trevor filled that hole that I was missing.” But Trevor was battling a rare immune disorder, and often in the hospital. Blood transfusions—588 of them—gave him more time to spend with his family and friends. “When I lost him, I felt like I was losing another brother.”

Trevor’s family decided to host a blood drive every year on May 16, his birthday. As soon as Brenna turned 16, she started to donate blood too. She remembers being so nervous that first donation, at his drive in 2023. She wasn’t sure she could do it, but she did! For Trevor and his memory, his legacy, for what he went through. “Trevor got transfusions all the time. It wasn’t a choice for him.”

Brenna graduated from high school this year and continues to donate regularly. She often brings friends along with her, encouraging many to donate for the first time. Brenna knows firsthand the impact they can make. “Sometimes it’s one donation for one patient. But sometimes it’s 588 donors for one patient.”

## Coming together as a family to ‘pay it forward’

Mindy’s journey with blood donation began through personal tragedy, when in 2016 her husband Vincent was diagnosed with leukemia at just 32 years old. Pregnant with their second son, doctors told her Vincent might not live to see the birth. But transfusions gave Vincent precious extra time which allowed him to meet and hold his newborn son.

To honor Vincent, Mindy hosts a blood drive during the midsummer shortage season. Her annual goal is to collect 50 units—one for each transfusion he received. It’s an important way of keeping his memory alive, especially for his two sons. “Even if they don’t remember him, they’re able to see how he affected people with his life,” said Vincent’s brother Craig. All dressed in orange, in support of leukemia awareness, and emblazoned with “#VincentStrong”, the family welcomes donors—many returning every year—with a pancake breakfast.

Mindy exemplifies unwavering dedication, compassion, and advocacy—values she’s passing on. “I told my older son; I hope you and your brother will keep it going. If we’re still here in 50 years, it will be like their daddy had a full life.”

He enjoys the community he has cultivated over the years. # Latorra Garland

## Celebrating life's precious moments and memories

When Jacob, Latorra's healthy, happy 13-year-old son, complained of persistent knee pain, Latorra scheduled a medical checkup. It was the beginning of an unexpected and difficult journey: Jacob was diagnosed with progressive bone cancer.

After his first round of chemotherapy, just days after his diagnosis, Jacob began to have respiratory distress. He was rushed to the ICU, where he received multiple blood transfusions. Though Jacob passed away only a few short months later, as Latorra says, "Every transfusion gave us another day to make memories—to spend more time with Jacob and see his beautiful, contagious smiles."

In Jacob's memory, Latorra has become a force-of-nature champion for blood donation, especially when it comes to the youngest in need. "I will always be an advocate and will donate blood as long as I am able. Jacob never gave up and neither will I." She's gladly shared her story to thousands at annual donor recognition banquets and center staff meetings. In 2022 Latorra founded Jacob Way, a children's cancer charity that helps families like hers focus on healing experiences. "No one should navigate this alone; together we can provide hope and strength."

## Creating an ever-widening, ever-lasting circle of generosity



Jeremy knows what a pint of blood can mean to a family in crisis. In 2011, his daughter was born with a life-threatening condition that limited her lung development. Her treatment required a constant supply of blood products. In those terrifying and uncertain days, it wasn't just machines or medicine that kept her alive—it was the selfless generosity of strangers. Thanks to them, Jeremy's daughter is now a healthy, thriving 14-year-old.

But Jeremy's connection to blood donation didn't start there. He actually began giving blood in high school, continuing even while serving in the Oklahoma Air National Guard—never knowing his family would one day be recipients, yet never wavering in his commitment to others. Driven by a profound sense of purpose, he has donated more than 480 times, with a current focus on platelets.

The people he has impacted is ever-expanding. When one of the center employees passed away from cancer, Jeremy created and gifted her family a handmade quilt crafted from all his blood drive T-shirts. He has now started to do the same for other patient families—stitching his compassion and experience into something tangible, something lasting.

## Teaching compassion, collaboration, and commitment

Englewood High School's National Honor Society began doing blood drives in 2009 after a staff member became critically ill with cancer and needed several transfusions. When Sarah Fuller, an English teacher, became faculty advisor for the Honor Society in 2015, she took on leadership of the drives as well. Under her incredible guidance and enthusiasm, it has become one of the strongest education-based programs in Colorado, resulting in 1,725 units collected—an average of 66 units at each event.

Sarah has her students work together to prepare for the two drives they hold each year in October and April. They engage school administrators and board directors and connect with local restaurants for food donations, ensuring fresh, hot pizzas keep coming throughout the day.

Their success is a great source of pride for Sarah. “These are my favorite events of the school year, and our students most memorable events as well. I will consistently get students asking when permission slips come out. It’s nice to see first time donors return, often encouraging friends to participate. And every now and then former students tell me they continue to donate even after graduation.”

## Building a corporate culture of dedicated blood donors

More than 15 years ago at a blood drive at his workplace, Blake shared his reason for donating with center Account Manager Heather Robenhymmer. His teenage son had cancer and needed numerous transfusions throughout his treatment—transfusions that, he said, “saved my son’s life on more than one occasion.”

At the time, participation in the company’s drives was declining. Heather saw Blake’s passion and suggested he help reinvigorate the program. From that moment on, Blake became one of the center’s most committed and effective advocates, setting the standard for successful partnerships with local organizations.

Blake has since built a strong culture of donation. He encouraged senior leaders to rally their teams, brought Blood Drive Ambassadors to tour the center’s labs, and secured financial, staff, and facility support during critical times. He even serves on the center’s Advocacy Board. Blake’s efforts and impact have been nothing short of transformational. Thanks to his leadership, his company now hosts four drives a year, averaging 500 donations each—making it the largest and most reliable blood drive in Rhode Island.

## Advocating for a lifetime commitment to blood donation

Kristine began donating when she was just 16, at a high school event. From then on, she gave as often as possible—whenever a drive was nearby. But her connection to blood donation became deeply personal when her two children, Matthew and Carswell, were diagnosed with a rare genetic disease.

Both boys required numerous blood and platelet transfusions—Matthew alone needed almost 40. Seeing firsthand how vital blood products are, Kristine and her family started hosting blood drives. They've been an overwhelming success and now average four per year. But in 2022, during one of the children's hospital stays, they experienced a platelet shortage. In that moment Kristine decided to go one step further for the cause. She began donating platelets regularly so that no one else would have to wait and wonder if help would arrive. In 2024, she reached her personal goal: 24 triple platelet donations in a single year.

Recently, Kristine created a short film to raise awareness about giving blood and inspire others not just to donate once, but to make it a long-term commitment—especially when it comes to the platelets her sons depended on.
